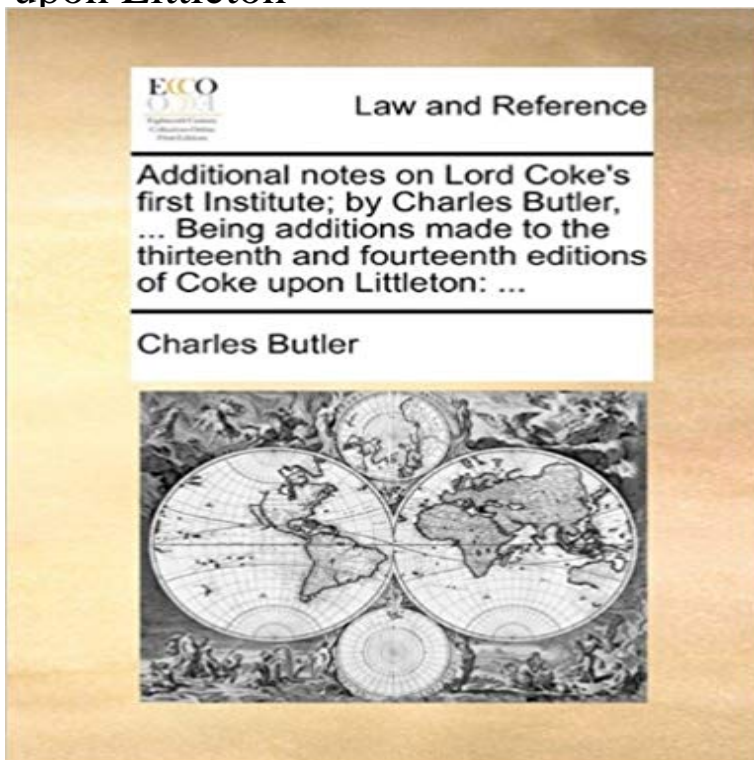


## Additional notes on Lord Cokes first Institute; by Charles Butler, ... Being additions made to the thirteenth and fourteenth editions of Coke upon Littleton
